

Lehigh hosted its first Town Hall on the Diversity, Inclusion & Equity (DI&E) Strategic Plan and Progress Measures on April 1. In the one-hour event, the first in a series of events to be held throughout the strategic plan's five years, Vice President for Equity and Community Dr. Donald A. Outing outlined the plan's creation, described the university's path forward in measuring progress, and took questions from the audience. The event was held in a hybrid format, with both in-person and Zoom participation, and was moderated by Dr. Rita Jones, Director of the Center for Gender Equity. The DI&E Strategic Plan was published in October. Various campus constituents then had input into the creation of the initial progress measures, which were shared with the campus community in late March. During the town hall, Outing stressed that these progress measures are just the starting point for moving forward. The university will continue to add to these measures as needed moving forward. Lehigh's Baker Institute is helping to tackle the issue of equity and inclusion in entrepreneurship with the launch of Rightful Inclusive Student Entrepreneurship, or R.I.S.E. It began as a grassroots effort to explore a long-time gender imbalance in student entrepreneurship on campus. Baker Institute Executive Director Lisa Getzler noticed a gender disparity in the number of students who proposed projects during EUREKA! Venture Program Pitch Nights. These monthly opportunities for students to pitch business ideas to a panel of reviewers, offer the chance to win funding, mentoring and other resources to help make these ideas a reality. Getzler noted that though fewer women pitched these projects, 50% of the Baker Institute's EUREKA! Joan F. and John M.Thalheimer '55 Grand Prize winners in the last 10 years have been women. And there isn't just a gender gap; further research into participation on campus showed disparities among other underrepresented groups as well. Thus, RISE was formally announced. 





